The world found itself in a once-in-a-lifetime pandemic in 2020 with the emergence of the COVID-19 virus. Pharmacists found themselves on the front lines of this public health crisis with little preparation or guidance. Existing emergency plans were of little use during a shutdown of the entire world. This activity will explore the ethics of responding appropriately to a rapidly evolving crisis. From emergency preparedness, communication, purchasing tactics, and justice of distribution of supplies, the COVID-19 pandemic taught the healthcare community how unprepared we were for this type of event. Lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic will be valuable to the pharmacy community to apply during the next crisis.
